Code of Conduct:

Code of Conduct reflects a positive environment that complies with an Islamic atmosphere and allows its congregation and visitors to fully enjoy Runnymede Muslim Society.

1. All individuals attending any Runnymede Muslim Society events or premises (including members, guest speakers, imam, khatib, muazzin, volunteers) shall always conduct themselves in the following manner:
 - a. Using Islamic manners in compliance with the Holy Qur'an and the Sunnah.
 - b. In ways that fosters unity and a sense of inclusion among all members of the community.
 - c. In manner that is respectful of the diversity of the local community and not discriminate based on madhhab, gender, race, nationality, location, ethnic origin, citizenship, political affiliation, or economic status.
 - d. Shall exercise tolerance and respect for the rights of others and their opinions.
 - e. Shall interact with all persons, Muslim and non-Muslim, in a manner that reflects positively on Runnymede Muslim Society.
 - f. Shall refrain from shouting and from speaking offensively of anyone, including intimidation.
 - g. Will not engage with, support, or promote extremist, violent or racist organisations or ideologies.

2. Members will act as positive role models, promoting good behaviour and family values.
3. Members will respect the role of the Trustee Board in overseeing and leading the organisation and will support Trustees and Chair to achieve that role.
4. Members will respect the Imam(s) appointed by the Trustees and will accept their authority on religious matters relating to Runnymede Muslim Society as delegated by the Trustees.
5. Members will not host, organise, or administer any meeting or group, either in person or on social media or using mobile communication channels, under the name/logo of Runnymede Muslim Society without the permission of the Trustee Board.

6. No one, including the volunteers of Runnymede Muslim Society, have the authority to make announcements, distribute leaflets & brochures, display of posters of any type, hold public meetings, organise any activities or programmes and carry out any type of fund raising without the approval by Runnymede Muslim Society trustees.
7. Any person, who wishes to speak to the congregation after Friday prayer, shall seek the consent of Runnymede Muslim Society.
8. Smoking is not permitted at any time inside Runnymede Muslim Society or on the grounds outside.
9. Food and beverages will not be allowed in Runnymede Muslim Society areas other than during Ramadan unless authorised by Runnymede Muslim Society.
10. Overnight staying is not permitted without prior approval by Runnymede Muslim Society.
11. Any misconduct or act that could endanger or damage the reputation of Runnymede Muslim Society, including posting damaging content on social media or otherwise will result in the membership being revoked, or person(s) being excluded, either permanently or for a fixed term.

Membership Terms & Conditions:

1. Trustees reserve the right to request proof of identity, address, date of birth or request for an enhanced DBS in relation to your application.
2. Submitting your application does not mean you have become a member. You will receive an email to inform you about the outcome of your application.
3. Applications will be processed, and a response provided within 21 days after the receipt of application in writing.
4. Becoming a member means you accept to receive communication via email as a means of being kept informed about membership matters only. If you have any questions, please email info@runnymedemuslims.uk
5. All members will be accountable for their actions and conduct related to Runnymede Muslim Society and its Trustees.
6. Trustees reserve the right to revoke membership if they feel that the Code of Conduct has not been followed, or to protect the best interests and goals of Runnymede Muslim Society.
7. Any action by members without prior permission from the trustees outside the scope of the organisation, such as charities work. Runnymede Muslim Society is not responsible for it.
